United Counseling Service (UCS) Division of Children, Youth and Family Services (CYFS) provides home and community-based services for children, adolescents, and young adults.

What is Psychiatric Urgent Care for Kids (PUCK)?

PUCK is a crisis stabilization program for youth in Bennington County who are experiencing a mental health or behavioral health crisis. A primary goal of PUCK is to keep youth in mental health crisis out of the emergency room.

Youth are screened by an Emergency Services staff member and, if appropriate, are referred to PUCK for further care and assessment.



What services does PUCK provide?

- A therapeutic environment staffed with highly trained people
- Mental health screenings and assessments
- Skill-building for regulating emotions and behaviors
- **Recommendations** for follow-up care in the home and school
- Follow-up consultation with school
- Access to psychiatric medication consultation
- Referral for mental health and family services
